Focusing on the Beach Boys "sunniest" years, 1962 to 1967, and with the use of performance and interview clips, we'll trace the path of the Beach Boys' early career from "Surfin' U.S.A", "Fun, Fun" and "California Girls" to "Good Vibrations" and more. From its historical beginnings in the 6th century BCE India, to its everyday appearance in our modern lives, followers of Buddhism have created pieces to express the religion's principles and for use by the faithful in worship. As Buddhism spread and changed, so too has the way its art looks.

There is a lot of science behind the magic of fireflies. Learn how and why lightning bugs light up, about the different species of fireflies, and how these beetles can be identified by their flash patterns. Eight Flavors: The Untold Story of American Cuisine by Sarah Lohman, Thu. June 22 at 7 pm on ZOOM

This illustrated lecture offers a fascinating look at our past and uses long-forgotten recipes to explain how eight flavors changed how Americans eat. After an overview, Sarah will focus on three particular flavors: curry powder, vanilla, and soy sauce.

Can you imagine a world without "Imagine"? The 10-year period from the Beatles' break up in 1970 to Lennon's tragic murder in 1980 was a fascinating period of successes and failures for the ex-Beatle. Using audio and visual content, this lecture will explore the music from "Imagine" to "(Just Like) Starting Over," his controversial immigration struggle and wild "lost weekend," and the quiet househusband years, culminating with the release of his final album, *Double Fantasy*.

La Serenissima: A Sojourn in Venice, Thu. June 29 at 7 pm on ZOOM

Venice has been known as the Most Serene Republic (La Serenissima). From its early incarnation as a refuge from invaders to its current place as a tourist mecca, local photographer and art and history enthusiast Bruce Magnuson will explore the many facets of Venetian history, art, and architecture. Weaving local references to Venice (the Gardner Museum anyone?) with photographs from a recent trip, you'll come away with a greater appreciation for this complicated, captivating city.

Still Blue with Elizabeth Goldring Piene, Thu. July 6 at 7 pm IN PERSON



Elizabeth Goldring, a long-time Groton resident, will read poems and comment on images from her latest book *Still Blue: New and Selected Poems and Retina Prints*. As a poet and visual artist who is legally blind, Goldring explores different ways of seeing—through the concision of poetic syntax, through her innovative experiments with the scanning laser ophthalmoscope while at MIT, and through poems that consider vision, its loss, disability more broadly, human mortality, natural beauty, destruction, and war. Her reading

will also include poems and images from her life in Groton.

Summer-Inspired Homemade Pasta with Chef Kelcy, Thu. August 3 at 7 pm on ZOOM
